
BIOESECURITY - FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE (FMD)

FARMERS AND LIVESTOCK HANDLERS ARE ON THE FRONT LINE

Even though all efforts are being made to contain the virus in Indonesia, early detection is essential to reduce the potential devastating impact of this disease. FMD is highly contagious and can be spread through close animal contact, carried on animal products, by the wind, mud or manure. Human infections are rare but the virus can stay in the nose for up to 24 hours and infect livestock.

When working with cattle, sheep, goats or pigs, signs of FMD include – Blisters and ulcerations in and around the mouth area, toes and heels - Drooling – Not eating - Limping.

LOOK UP & LIVE - THE DANGER OF OVERHEAD POWERLINES

Trucks and machinery are getting larger and roads are being resurfaced but powerlines are still the same height. They can be difficult to see at dawn, dusk and during bad weather. They can also sag 2-3 metres in extreme heat and sway in strong winds.

You may be much closer than you think.

To keep farm, machinery and transport operator safe -

- Know the height of your vehicle
- Be aware of your environment when on the road
 - Park large machinery away from powerlines
- Stack hay and other combustibles far away from powerlines
 - Consider your race positioning loading zones

You don't need to touch a powerline for it to arc
