








CHRISTMAS BREAK & FAMILY TIME - HERE WE COME!!




Every effort will be made for Morris Transport operators to spend the festive season celebrating with their families.

FEED CURFEWS BEFORE TRANSPORATION



Prior to cattle and sheep transportation, Animal
Health Australia and the National Heavy Vehicle
Regulator (NHVR) strongly advocate a feed curfew on
livestock.

Cattle - 6 hours / Sheep 12 hours.

This is to reduce soiling, minimise excessive effluent spillage and maintain conditioning.
